As a young child, prayer to me was either saying the "This night as I lay down to sleep..." prayer, seeking blessing for a long list of relatives whose names I had to remember, in order, or the long winded, off the cuff types in a service, where I staved off boredom and fidgeting by counting the number of times one old man, who loved the sound of his own voice, said "Oh, Lord..." in a particularly dramatic and doom-laden tone - think Fraser in Dads' Army! As a teenager, I would experience Cathedral choirs singing Latin prayers, charismatics praying in tongues, repetition of The Lord's Prayer or The Shema, and the earnest pleading with God in a prayer meeting, to intervene in a particular situation of injustice or suffering. As an adult, having worshipped in many different denominations in different circumstances, my experience has been broadened and enriched. Art, movement, activities at prayer stations, walking a labyrinth or in woods, even silence, has been added to the mix. I'm sure many of you will have similar experiences of different ways to

pray in a formal setting, or in your own life.

None of these experiences are 'wrong' or 'right', just different ways of communicating with a God who loves to hear from us, and converse with us. We might feel that our prayers must be eloquent, that prayer is best articulated by a 'professional' and then we can say 'Amen'. We might think that God will not be interested in the everyday goings-on in our lives. We might be tempted to keep a shell around our inner life, present a smooth, perfect exterior, not just to our acquaintances, but also to God. But I would encourage you to break that shell, to be really open with God, and see what a difference it makes to your relationship.

This week, I came across some advice from an unnamed Rabbi who has spent his life on the streets of New York, rescuing children from homelessness and prostitution.

"When you pray, talk to God just as if you were talking to your best friend. Tell the Holy One everything. Especially, dedicate specific times each day when you tell God about all your worries, all your hurts, all of your problems. Take off your mask and just speak. If you do that, if you really let your whole essence speak to God like that, some days there will be a lot of tears. But that's a good thing. And when you are done telling God about your hurts... just silently rest in God, letting God hold you. And then for the rest of the day practice joy and optimism knowing that you are God's beloved child, knowing that you are loved, and knowing that you are carrying a great gift in your heart... In some of the most difficult times in my life, this way of prayer is what saved me—telling God everything, crying with God, wrestling with God, and then when all is said and done, just resting in God, feeling loved into newness, feeling loved into aliveness and joy."

You might like to try 'Pause', or two each day to rest in **II** God's presence.
